



- 1 MT. BALLYHOO**
ELEVATION 1634 FT
2 MILES | MODERATE
A steep hike up the face of the Ballyhoo summit
- 2 BUNKER HILL**
1 MILE | EASY
an old military road (closed to vehicles) leads up 400 ft to a bunker a military ruins
- 3 UGADAGA TRAIL**
2.2 MILES | EASY
a one and a half mile hike downhill to Ugadaga bay from the trail start at about 800 ft.
- 4 MT. NEWHALL**
ELEVATION 1651 FT
2 MILES | MODERATE
a steep hike up the face of Mt. Newhall Summit Parking available near Memorial Park
- 5 PYRAMID VALLEY TRAIL**
2.7 MILES | MODERATE
an old military road leads up to a trail through the Pyramid Valley

PLEASE HIKE SAFELY
Be mindful of potential dangers, which may include unstable rock at the edge of a cliff or rapidly changing weather conditions.

- Pay close attention to your surroundings
- Use good judgement
- Never hike alone
- Keep your hiking party together

FUN FACTS

- 1 Unalaska/Dutch Harbor is roughly 800 air miles from Anchorage, Alaska. Flight time is typically 3 to 3.5 hours on most passenger aircraft that service this route.
- 2 Unalaska's Port of Dutch Harbor is the #1 commercial fishing port in the nation in terms of volume.
- 3 The latitude and longitude of Unalaska/Dutch Harbor is 53.8890°N, and 166.5272°W, making it further west than Hawaii and further south than Ketchikan.
- 4 Dutch Harbor was a naval base during WWII and was bombed by the Japanese on June 3rd & 4th, 1942.
- 5 Archaeologists have found evidence that people have inhabited the Aleutian Islands for at least 9,000 years.
- 6 Makushin Volcano is the highest point on Unalaska Island at 5,906 ft.
- 7 During the summer, an estimated 40 million seabirds nest throughout the Aleutians.
- 8 The current IGFA all-tackle world record for a 459 pound / 8 ft. long, Pacific halibut was caught in Dutch Harbor in June 1996.
